Also the solar lights in the Heritage Park along the pathway are currently being installed.

Together we can achieve much. Our town has recently lost its green oasis look due to pump breakdowns which pumps water from the Goldfields pit. TRIBUTE TO KATH MEYERING

23/3/1929 to 7 /8/2017

Those who have been around the Top End for a while may have personally known or know of Kath Meyering. Kath and her husband Ralph have lived in Noonamah for decades where they started the first Territory dairy farm. Later on when Kath took up flying and started her own airline service into Arnhem land (at age 50) Kath and Ralph built the airstrip and hangers to support the small plane owners. About 20 years ago Kath purchased a property in Pine Creek and located a small aircraft and pilot at Pine Creek for charter work and scenic flights over Kakadu & Katherine Gorge. It is at that time that I came to know and admire Kath Meyering.

She was a woman of great courage and fearlessness. Kath was a woman who loved machines; trucks, cars and especially planes. She told me once that the most dangerous thing about flying was driving to the airport!

I remember having a cup of tea with Kath as she passed through Pine Creek on her way to Perth with her grandchildren. She was in a little van and was hitting the road for a holiday with the grandkids. She was well into her 60's at that time. In more recent years Kath decided to visit her eldest granddaughter in Tasmania and thought nothing of taking off for a road trip to Melbourne and then the car ferry to Tassie; on her own. She was over 80 at the time.

Kath had a wonderful can-do attitude and she did it all.

In 2016 we were fortunate to have Kath as one of our guest speaker at the Pine Creek International Day dinner.

Kath delighted all those present with her anecdotes and humour. I feel honoured to have been able to call this wonderful, adventurous, courageous, funny, spiritual woman friend for over 20 years. Kath is survived by her husband Ralph, children Louise, Peter and Fred and numerous grandchildren and great grandchildren.

We have said goodbye to a true pioneering Territorian.

Another Local Authority project has been completed for Pine Creek.

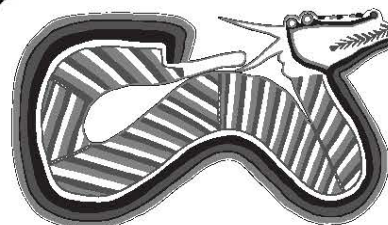
Heritage Park Playground, Stage 1, has been finalized and we have received some terrific feedback.

FOSSICKING INFORMATION

Do I need a permit?

No permit is needed to fossick in the Northern Territory. However you may need to notify some landowners / occupiers of your intention to fossick on their land.

Where can I fossick?

You can fossick on any land providing the correct notifications and consents are gained. There are no restrictions to fossicking on the following land and a person may fossick without giving notice of their intention or obtaining consent, to do so:

- vacant Crown land

a [declared fossicking area](#)

- the application area of an exploration licence or extractive mineral exploration licence
- the granted area of an extractive mineral exploration licence.

Note: If fossicking in a declared fossicking area, you must comply with any conditions imposed by the Northern

Territory Minister in addition to any other laws in force in relation to the land.

If not within a declared fossicking area, you must comply with the reasonable conditions or requests of the landowner/occupier or mineral title holder of the land on which you are fossicking.

Where can't I fossick?

[Aboriginal sacred sites](#)

any Commonwealth land including defence facilities and national parks such as Uluru and Kakadu

Can I fossick on proposed fossicking Areas?

These areas have not been gazetted as declared fossicking areas as yet and but have been gazetted as reserved land. The [Department of Primary Industry and Resources](#) is in the process of identifying specific areas within this gazetted region for declaration as fossicking areas. This process may take some time as many factors, such as native title implications and consent from landowners, need to be considered prior to any declaration taking place.

In the meantime, you are permitted to access these areas after obtaining the appropriate consents from the Minister ([fossicking request form - reserved land](#)) and notifying the pastoralist of your intentions ([fossicking notice/request form](#)).

Do I need to notify anyone before fossicking?

Prior to entering certain areas to fossick, you may need to give at least 7 days' written notice (a fossicking notice) to the landowner/occupier or mineral title holder. In circumstances where written consent is required, you must request consent in writing (a fossicking request) from the landowner/occupier and/or title holder, at least 14 days in advance.

It is important to note that due to the size and remoteness of some pastoral properties in the Territory, mail may only be received on a fortnightly or monthly basis. Please take this into account and plan ahead, providing as much notice as possible.

Entry onto the land is not permitted until consent is received.

Before you can determine whether you need to notify anyone, you must firstly work out what the land tenure is and whether there are any granted mineral titles or applications for mineral titles in the area you wish to conduct fossicking activities. Once land tenure is established, refer to information bulletin: [fossicking - land access](#) for details of what land requires a [fossicking notice](#) or a [fossicking request](#)

Are domestic animals allowed?

Domestic animals/pets (such as a dog or cat etc) pose a threat to native fauna, may unsettle livestock and disrupt pastoral activities. If you are travelling with a domestic animal, you must make alternative arrangements for their care, prior to entering any land to fossick.

FOSSICKING INFORMATION

What documents do I need to carry with me when fossicking?

When carrying out fossicking activities, you and members of your fossicking party must have in your possession:

- photographic identification; and
- in relation to land or a title area where a person is required to give a fossicking notice - proof that a fossicking notice was given;
- in relation to all land where consent has been given to fossick - the document giving consent; or
- where a person is required to obtain written consent, has served the fossicking request and no written response is received within 2 months, consent is deemed. If a fossicker has entered the land under this condition, they are required to carry proof that they gave a fossicking request to the landowner.

You must show the documents to any of the following persons who ask to see them and failure to do so can result in penalties:

- the landowner/occupier of the land
- if the land is in the title area of a mineral title, the title holder
- an authorised officer or police officer.

You are also obligated to comply with other laws in force in relation to the land on which you are fossicking

Can I carry or use firearms and other weapons?

You are not permitted to use or carry any form of firearm or offensive weapon while undertaking fossicking activities regardless of the underlying land tenure.

What else should I not do?

1. disturb livestock
2. camp within one kilometre of, or wash in, dams, bores, billabongs or tanks which are used for livestock water
3. light an open fire in an uncleared area or where there is a fire ban or gusty winds, or leave a fire unattended at any time
4. use water conserved artificially, such as a dam, on the land without the landowners consent engage in activities not related to fossicking

Where can I camp?

Camping is permitted on some fossicking areas. Fossicking areas where camping is permitted do not provide any on site facilities, including water supplies. You will need to be self-sufficient.

In all other areas, you are not entitled to camp anywhere you wish and should seek permission from the landowner/occupier or mineral title holder.



COMMUNITY PATROL BIKE PROJECT

Recently I made the unorthodox decision to try riding an old tip bike from Darwin to Mataranka towing a heavily laden trailer. I cycle regularly but by no means consider myself a fit specimen.

The truth is my wife had been at me for some time to get rid of some of the 'junk' I had lying around the place and from there the idea grew. When I dragged the old bike out from behind the shed I couldn't move the handlebars or the crank because the bearings had seized due to exposure to one too many wet seasons.

That was no biggie, I did what I could to free everything up, slapped on some grease, made a few adjustments and before long I had quite a reasonable rig put together.

The plan was to travel along the Stuart Highway and as many backroads as I could find. I figured I'd time the ride with the full moon, cycling in the moonlight is really nice, you should try it.

It wasn't long before the novelty of towing a fully laden trailer wore off! I'd chosen to begin my ride on a public holiday and although I am quite used to cycling in traffic,

nothing can prepare a cyclist for the spine chilling experience of negotiate the thin line between the bitumen and the dirt while cars towing caravans are barreling toward you as they attempt to overtake a three dog road train!

After nearly ten hours on the road I pulled into Adelaide River absolutely exhausted and determined to catch the next bus home to safety. The next day I woke feeling rested and happy to be out of town. I kept an eye on the traffic and found there were far less vehicles on the road. Hung out at the ARSS, fixed the gears on my bike so I could finally shift down to 1st and plotted a course for Hayes Creek.

I chose to ride the Dorat Rd, I'd been warned against it because of hills and blind corners, but there hadn't been much traffic all day. I was so glad I took that road rather than the Highway. What a ripper! Leaving at 3:30pm and travelling slow I knew I'd be travelling after sundown. The trailer had a few blow outs along the way but no big problem. Saw quite a bit of wildlife, a few feral dogs and some pretty hefty Brahman cattle along the way. None gave me any hassle and the views along that road were divine! By the time I passed the Daly River turnoff the sun had begun to set. For the next couple of hours I rode by the light of the moon! It was brilliant! (Literally... it shone brightly.)

Pulled into Hayes Creek and was greeted by the owner of the tavern who happens to be a pastry chef! It was about 9pm, after closing time but she made sure I had a cool drink of water and even prepared me one of her pies, OK I was hungry but I still reckon she makes the best pies ever!

Next morning I figured I'd make my way to Pine Creek and rest there for half a day but about 20 km out of town the bearings in the crank began to seize and I realized that it would be too risky to go beyond Pine Creek.

Discarding my original plan I decided to chill out for a couple of days. What a great idea this turned out to be. Taking a bit more time than usual gave me a great opportunity to experience the hospitality of some genuinely friendly and helpful people. I also got to do a few short rides on local tracks and experience the natural beauty of the area. The birdlife is spectacular with species we never see in Darwin, Hooded parrots, Diamond doves, and Cockatiels were a treat.

I had intended to give my bike away to someone in Mataranka when the journey was over and wondered what I should do now. On the day I was to leave I noticed an article in Up the Creek newspaper which gave the perfect answer!

The article referred to a project run by the local Night Patrol team who were looking for bikes to restore and work on with local kids. What a great idea! I got in touch with Shayne and dropped the bike off later that day. I really enjoyed hearing about the involvement of Night Patrol and locals in creating activities that engage kids in the community. As I left on the Greyhound later that afternoon I felt like breaking down was the best thing that could have happened to me on this trip.

A big thanks to the generous people I met along the way. I'll definitely be back to visit.

- * Anyone without a Medicare card cannot be seen by a GP at this clinic, you will need to go to Katherine Hospital or to see a private GP there.

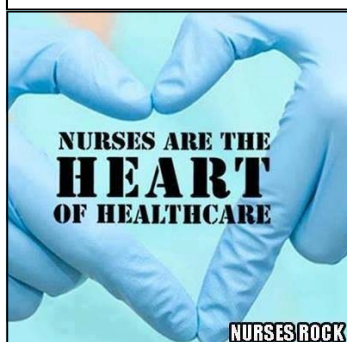

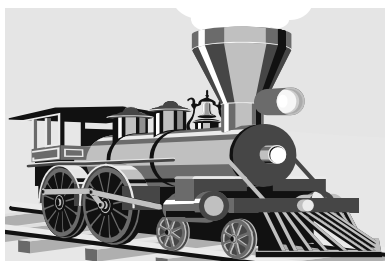
