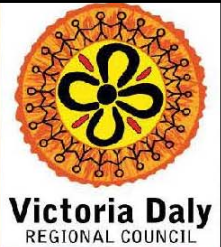

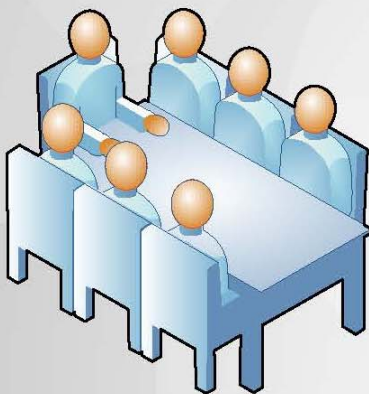

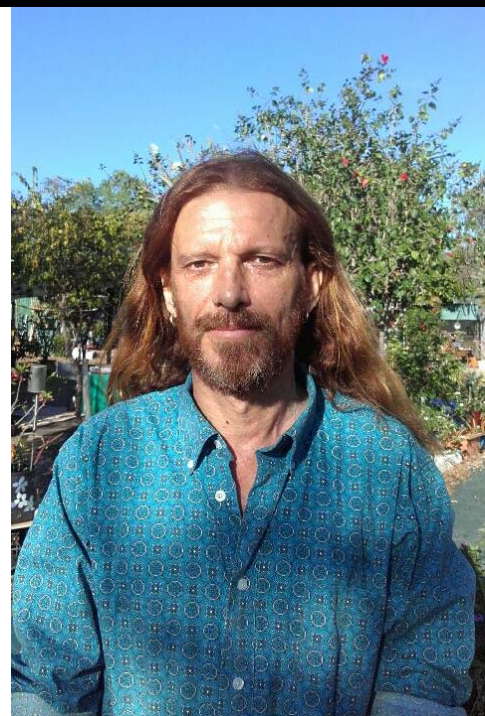

NEWS FROM KYBROOK FARM

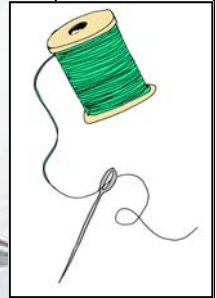

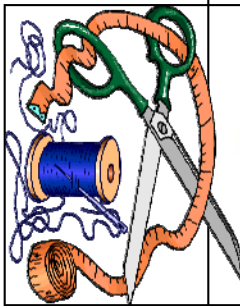

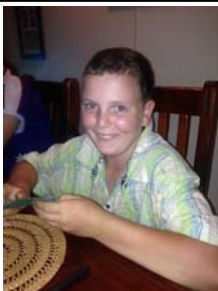

Please be aware of the following changes at the Pine Creek Clinic over the coming weeks.....

- * The clinic will be commencing structural renovations commencing Tuesday 8th August 2017.
- * We are expecting that there will be some minor inconveniences to people attending over the following 6 to 8 weeks.
- * As there will be asbestos removal we will have some areas of the clinic sealed off whilst this takes place.
- * We will continue to offer the same service as always however there will be some delays and interruptions from time to time.
- * A new GP from Katherine Hospital starts at the Clinic next Tuesday 25th July 2017 – Doctor Paula Ferguson.
- * Dr Ferguson will be working Tuesday and Wednesday's at the clinic.
- * Dr Cameron Smith will continue to work each Tuesday.
- * To avoid disappointment please remember that you need to book 2 weeks ahead to see a GP and that preference is always given to residents.
- * If you are a visitor you will need to provide evidence that you have been in residence in Pine Creek for more than 6 weeks before being booked to see the GP
- * Anyone without a Medicare card cannot be seen by a GP at this clinic, you will need to go to Katherine Hospital or to see a private GP there.

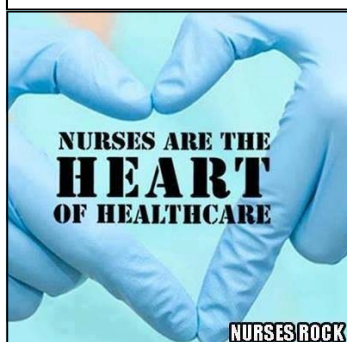

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION FOR AN ABORIGINAL JUSTICE AGREEMENT

The Northern Territory Government has established an Aboriginal Justice Unit within the Department of the Attorney-General and Justice, to improve justice outcomes in the Territory and secure an Aboriginal Justice Agreement.

The Aboriginal Justice Agreement will:

- set out how the government and Aboriginal people will work together to make justice work in the NT;
- build trust and engagement on justice issues in the NT;
- focus on practical solutions to reduce the levels of Indigenous incarceration and reoffending;
- deliver strategies for the implementation of more local decision-making in the justice system.
- reduce the over-representation of Aboriginal people in the criminal justice system;
- reduce the high levels of disadvantage of Aboriginal people in the Northern Territory; and
- provide Aboriginal people with services that support human rights, improve and build individual and community resilience.

The Government also hopes that this will lead to safer, stronger, and more resilient communities, and increase the positive contact between Aboriginal people and the justice system.

The Aboriginal Justice Unit has already begun discussions about the Aboriginal Justice Agreement with key Aboriginal peak bodies in the Territory, and will:

- work in partnership with Aboriginal communities to address complex issues and ensure accountability;
- ensure government agencies do not work in isolation in the delivery of projects and programs that impact on Aboriginal people and the justice system;
- develop tailored, targeted responses for early intervention, diversion, best practice rehabilitation programs that work with family units, the offender, the family unit, the community and extended family members to focus on breaking the cycle of offending to ensure clients have the best chance of success not to re-offend when they return to their communities; and
- ensure Aboriginal people have access to all services within the justice portfolio within a culturally competent framework.

The Unit's six-member team is holding consultations across the Northern Territory over the next 12 months. To date community consultations have been held in Belyuen, Batchelor, Naiyu (Daly River), Bagot and Pine Creek. Over the month of August further consultations will be held in Palmerston Indigenous Village (10 August), Acacia (16 August) and Kybrook Farm (17 August). Posters advising of the time and venue for those consultations will be appearing on your local community notice board soon.

The community consultations are an opportunity to advise the Government about issues you or someone you know have experienced when trying to access justice related services, either as a defendant, witness, victim, or in another capacity. The information you provide will be used to develop an Aboriginal Justice Agreement to improve justice outcomes for Aboriginal Territorians, and to make our community safer. 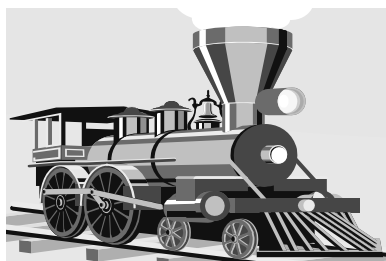
